BJ's, Brookville Market, CVS, Costco, Food Lion, Harris Teeter, H-Mart Han Ah Rum, K-Mart, Magruder's (all), Petco, Petsmart, Potomac Wine and Spirits, Rite-Aid, Royal Farms, Sam's Discount Warehouse, Shoppers Food Warehouse, Trader Joe's, Walgreens, Walmart, Wegman's, Whole Foods, Winn-Dixie and all establishments under Capitol K supervision.

Please note that chometz may NOT be purchased at Giant, Safeway or Target immediately after Pesach as the distributor who supplies these stores is Jewish. Chometz may be purchased from these stores beginning on May 13, 2012, four weeks after Pesach.

Rabbinic Intern Selection Process

Kesher Israel will once again be hosting a rabbinic intern beginning next fall. The Selection Committee is nearing the final stage in selecting a candidate. Each of the two remaining candidates will be visiting Kesher and spending a Shabbat with the community.

The first candidate, **Tuvia Brander**, will join us the weekend of **April 27th**. Tuvia is a Yeshiva University student majoring in Mathematics and minoring in Jewish Studies with a focus on bible studies. He expects to receive smicha from RIETS in 2014.

The second candidate, **Moishe Farkas**, who join us the weekend of **May 5th**. Moishe is a Yeshiva University student who majored in Economics. He is currently pursuing a masters in Jewish Education. He expects to receive smicha from RIETS in 2013.

Each candidate will give the drasha after minyan on Shabbat morning, both at hashkama and the main service, give an hour-long shiur before Mincha, and speak at Seudah Sheleshit.

We encourage you come and enjoy their various lectures and to provide feedback on the candidates to the Selection Committee. The Committee includes: **Howard Slugh, Sharon Volotzky, David and Sarah Barak, and Ilan Weinberger**. The committee will make its final decision by Sunday, May 13, so please provide your comments/thoughts by then. Once a decision has been made and the candidates are notified, an announcement will be sent to the community.

Yom haShoah Lecture with Dr. Steven Katz

Dr. Steven Katz, Director of the Elie Wiesel Center for Judaic Studies at Boston University and the United

States Holocaust Museum's Senior Scholar in Residence, will be speaking at Kesher Israel on Sunday evening, **April 29** at 8:15pm to commemorate Yom haShoah, on the topic of **Auschwitz**. The lecture will focus on the nature and meaning of Auschwitz, especially for those not killed on arrival. Dr. Katz will consider such central issues as the material conditions under which Jews existed-- food, water, housing, clothing and heating; the issues of corporal punishment; so-called "sportmache" medical experiments; the treatment of women and children; and Jews as slave laborers. Dr. Katz will also speak about the various paradoxes this form of existence created.

Prior to joining the faculty at Boston University, Dr. Katz was a Professor of Near Eastern Studies at Cornell University in New York, where he was Chair of the Department of Near Eastern Studies from 1985 to 1988, and Director of the Jewish Studies Program from 1985 to 1989. In addition to holding teaching appointments at Dartmouth College and Cornell University, he has been a visiting professor at Yale, the University of California at Santa Barbara, the Hebrew University, Jerusalem, and at the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Katz was Chair of the Academic Committee of the United States Holocaust Museum for five years and still serves on that committee and is the Chair of the Holocaust Commission of the Memorial Foundation for Jewish Culture. He is one of the American representatives to the International Task Force on the Holocaust, established by the King of Sweden, now sponsored by the European Union.
