Shabbos Parshas Nitzavim is always the last Shabbos

reading of the year, and often, as this year, it is joined with Parshas Vayelech. The Rebbe would always say that nothing is incidental, and surely matters related to Torah and Mitzvos are specific and meaningful.

Nitzavim means "standing upright". The Torah empowers every Jew to recognize that notwithstanding all of the possibilities for error over the course of the ending year, on this final Shabbos we still "stand upright" in the eyes of Hashem. The conclusion of the month of Elul brings with it the potential for every Jew to tap into the deepest recesses of our Souls and reveal true Infinite potentials. Ani L'dodi, I am to my beloved, meaning to say that I am defined by Hashem's True Reality and I resolve to rededicate my New Year with this inspiration. It is our's for the asking.

Parshas Vayelech then is a call to action that one must take after coming to this resolution. Nitzavim tells you who you are, and that Infinite potential. Vayelech tells you how far you can go with that recognition. Vayelech means "and he went ", referring to the journey of the



Parshat Nitzavim-Vayelech

The Parshah of *Nitzavim* includes some of the most fundamental principles of **the Jewish faith**:

The <u>unity of Israel</u>: "You stand today, all of you, before the L-rd your G-d: your <u>heads</u>, your <u>tribes</u>, your <u>elders</u>, your <u>officers</u>, and <u>every Israelite man</u>; your <u>young ones</u>, your <u>wives</u>, the <u>stranger</u> in your gate; from your <u>wood hewer</u> to your <u>water drawer</u>."

The **future redemption:** Moses warns of the exile and **desolation** of the Land that will result if Israel abandons G-d's laws, but then he prophesies that, in the end, "You will return to the L-rd your G-d... If your outcasts shall be at the ends of the heavens, from there will the L-rd your G-d gather you... and bring you into the Land which your fathers have possessed."

The <u>practicality of Torah</u>: "For the Mitzvah which I command you this day, it is not beyond you nor is it remote from you. It is <u>not in heaven</u>... It is not across the sea.... Rather, it is <u>very close</u> to you, in your <u>mouth</u>, in your <u>heart</u>, that you may <u>do it</u>."

<u>Freedom of choice</u>: "I have set before you life and goodness, and death and evil; in that I command you this day to love G-d, to walk in His ways and to keep His commandments... Life and death I have set before you, blessing and curse. And you shall choose <u>life</u>."

The Parshah of Vayelech (" And He Went") recounts the events on Moses' last day of earthly life. "I am one hundred and twenty years old today," he says to the people, "and I can no longer go forth and come in." He transfers the leadership to Joshua, and writes (or concludes writing) the Torah in a scroll which he entrusts to the Levites for safekeeping in the Ark of the Covenant.

Passing of Rebbetzin Devorah Leah(1792) 10 Days of Repentance; Shabbat Shuvah The mitzvah of *Hak'hel* (" **Gather**") is given: every seven years, during the festival of Sukkot of the first year of the **shemittah cycle**, the entire people of Israel -- men, women and children -- should gather at the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, where the **king** should read to them from the Torah.

Vayelech concludes with the prediction that the people of Israel will turn away from their covenant with G-d causing Him to https://doi.org/10.1001/j.com/ from them, but also with the promise that the words of the Torah "shall not be forgotten out of the mouths of their <a href="https://descendants."
