The opportunity for parents, grandparents and children to sit together and share the most fundamental tenets of our faith is truly special and holy. The opportunity to bond together as a family over Yom Tov meals cannot be underestimated. Unfortunately, this year is not like most years. <u>The reality is that families simply cannot gather as they have in the past. Our infectious disease advisors unanimously and strenuously urged us to speak out against any gatherings beyond the nuclear family currently living in the same home. This is true even for children, parents and grandparents who might otherwise visit. This is true for family in town as well as out of town family.</u>

Please know that these restrictions are for your protection, for the protection of your family and for the protection of our community. Taking care of one's health is paramount. <u>Adhering to the guidelines that have been established is something the halacha mandates</u>. Our experience has shown that in communities where there has been laxity and indifference concerning mandated precautions, tragedy, loss of life and sorrow have ensued.
